Dog licenses:

New license: please supply proof of rabies vaccinations & of spay/neuter and submit with payment - \$13 for intact dogs/\$5 for spayed or neutered dogs

Renewals: please supply license renewal paperwork with payment and proof of rabies vaccination if rabies information on form is expired or expiring within 30 days - \$13 for intact dogs/\$5 for spayed or neutered dogs

Transfer Station – temporarily closed, if you need to get rid of any trash in the meantime, please contact Genesee ARC at 585-343-4203 or find pricing and hours at ARCgo.org, click on Business Services and choose Trash & Recycling. As of 4/1/2020 their hours are Mon, Wed & Sat from 8AM – 2pm as a drive thru service. Trash is charged by weight and recycling is \$1 per 10 gallons. They also take bulk items and deposit able cans & bottle.

Taxes – effective April 1, 2020 all tax payments must be made through the Genesee County Treasurer’s Office or online at genesee.go2gov.net

Sewer Payments – please submit payments with the stub from the bottom of the bill. Please verify that you are using the correct account number off your bill in the memo section of your check.

Fishing License – may be purchased online at www.dec.ny.gov/permits/6091.html you are able to immediately print your fishing license on regular paper when purchased this way.

Marriage License – temporarily suspended at this time
